**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CEDAR HILLS, UTAH IN SUPPORT OF PROTECTING THE FUNDAMENTAL RIGHT OF THE PEOPLE TO KEEP AND BEAR ARMS AS SECURED UNDER THE SECOND AMENDMENT OF THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION.**

**WHEREAS**, a government of, by, and for the people has long been a cherished American value and the foundation of our freedom; and We The People's fundamental and inalienable right to self-govern, and thereby secure rights to life, liberty, property, and the pursuit of happiness is guaranteed in the U.S. Constitution and the Declaration of Independence, and;

**WHEREAS**, the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution states, "A well-regulated militia being necessary to the security of a free state, the right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed."

**WHEREAS**, the Tenth Amendment to the United States Constitution provides: "The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people," and;

**WHEREAS**, the Utah Constitution, Article XXX Section 23a declares: "Every citizen shall have the right to keep and bear arms in the lawful defense of himself or the State," in which we should uphold and;

**WHEREAS**, under the separation of powers doctrine, the judicial branch of government has the responsibility of interpreting the law (Marbury v. Madison, 5 U.S. 137 (1803)).

**WHEREAS**, in the case of District of Columbia v. Heller, 554 U.S. 570 (2008), the United States Supreme Court held that the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution protects an individual's right to possess a firearm for traditionally lawful purposes.

**WHEREAS**, this right to bear arms applies to the individual states and may not be infringed upon by the same (see McDonald v. Chicago, 561 US 3025 (2010)).

**WHEREAS**, the United States Supreme Court held in Printz v. United States, 521 U.S. 898, 935, (1997), that Congress cannot issue directives requiring local law enforcement officers, to administer or enforce federal gun control regulation" and;

**WHEREAS**, the Utah Constitution , Article 1 Section 6, states, "The individual right of the people to keep and bear arms for security and defense of self, family, others, property, or the state, as well as for other lawful purposes shall not be infringed; but nothing herein shall prevent the Legislature from defining the lawful use of arms".

**WHEREAS**, the citizens of Cedar Hills, Utah recognize their duty as law-abiding citizens to act in accordance with the U.S. Constitution and the Utah Constitution, and agree that the right to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed upon by any government or organization, political or otherwise.

**WHEREAS**, the State of Utah has declared in Utah Code §76-10-500 that the individual right to keep and bear arms is a constitutionally protected right.

**WHEREAS**, the Legislature has enacted legislation to ensure uniform laws throughout the State in regards to firearms, stating, "All authority to regulate firearms shall be reserved to the state except where the Legislature specifically delegates responsibility to local authorities or state entities. Unless specifically authorized by the Legislature by statute, a local authority or state entity may not enact or enforce any ordinance, regulation, or rule pertaining to firearms" (Utah Code §76-10-500).

**WHEREAS**, the Utah Supreme Court has determined that the sale, use and possession of firearms are proper subjects of regulation by the State (see, e.g., Univ. of Utah v. Shurtleff, 2006 UT 51, 144 P.3d 1109 (Utah 2006) and State v. Beorchia, 530 P.2d 813 (Utah 1974)).

**WHEREAS**, the only delegated authority given by the State to municipalities to exercise its legislative authority in regards to firearms is to "regulate and prevent the discharge of firearms" within the City (Utah Code §10-8-47).

**WHEREAS**, the City of Cedar Hills is a political subdivision of the State of Utah and derives its legislative authority from the State (Utah Code §10-1-201).

**NOW THEREFORE**, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF CEDAR HILLS CITY, UTAH AS FOLLOWS:

**BE IT RESOLVED** that the City of Cedar Hills with the strongest of conviction reaffirms that the right to keep and bear arms is a fundamental right to a free society and thus must be vigorously protected by the State of Utah and its elected representatives. The citizen's representatives, City Council and Mayor of Cedar Hills, Utah hereby call upon our President, our U.S. Senators from the State of Utah, our U.S. Congressman from the State of Utah, our state legislators and local elected officials to join with us in the affirmation of the rights of our citizens under the Second Amendment.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the City of Cedar Hills recognizes the right to keep and bear arms as a fundamental right of the citizens of Cedar Hills which is protected by the constitutions of the United States of America and of the State of Utah.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the City of Cedar Hills opposes restrictive firearms laws and regulations insofar as they infringe upon the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution and which limit the rights of law-abiding citizens to their fundamental right to keep and bear arms.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** the City of Cedar Hills, Utah strongly supports our citizens' right to keep and bear arms under the Second Amendment and does not support any law that would deprive any citizen of the rights guaranteed and protected under the U.S. Constitution, Bill of Rights, the Utah Constitution. We urge the Congress of the United States to monitor and defend against any infringement of these rights.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the City of Cedar Hills within its lawful powers will take any and all action necessary to protect and defend its citizens' Second Amendment right to keep and bear arms.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the City of Cedar Hills recognizes the United States Constitution as being an inspired document conveying upon its citizens certain inalienable rights bestowed upon the people by our judicious founding fathers.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the City of Cedar Hills, Utah encourages all of its residents to be aware, educated, informed and responsible taking all necessary measures that individuals see fit to take in order to protect both themselves and their family.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** the City of Cedar Hills, Utah calls on other communities and jurisdictions to join with us in this action by passing similar Resolutions.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that copies of this Resolution be immediately transmitted to the President of the United States; the President of the United States Senate; each member of the United States Senate from Utah; each member of Congress from the State of Utah; the Attorney General of the State of Utah; the Governor of the State of Utah; the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives of Utahs' legislature; each individual legislator that represents our district in the State of Utah; the Sheriff of Utah County; and the Chief of the American Fork Police Department.



Based on the submittals and interview process, the committee recommends that the City proceed to negotiate a final concessions contract with Sammy's Pie Shakes. The committee also recognized the value of the recommended company in relation to: hours of operation including Sunday opening, breakfast lunch and dinner menus, signage, décor, partnership potential with schools and other local groups, equipment value, potential catering services, marketing, and contract fees.

## **SECTION 1 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

In May of 2008, Sam Schultz, at the time the owner of a very successful catering company located in Provo, Utah, opened the first Sammy's Café in downtown Provo. The response by college and high school students, as well as local business lunch crowds, was overwhelming. And even in a location that can only seat 18 people inside, with an additional 15 seats outside in the summer, the Provo location continues to be the highest grossing location, of the three Sammy's Café restaurants currently in operation. The Rexburg location, which opened in 2010, and has a very large dining, is a close second in gross monthly revenue. And the Salt Lake City downtown location, which opened in the middle of 2012, grows each month over the previous, closing the gap separating it from Provo and Rexburg.

Sammy's operates as an LLC in the state of Utah. The Business License Number is 50122.

The secret to Sammy's success has been the ability to connect with the community, particularly with students. Sam has used a number of social media tools including Facebook, YouTube, Instagram, Twitter, as well as Smartphone applications specific to directing people to food service locations like Yelp, to bring customers in to each location. Making the community aware of Sammy's opening, the unique menu, and how people can be a part of the "feel" Sammy's offers, has been a key to the successful business plan. And so Sammy's doesn't just open a new location, each one has a GRAND OPENING LAUNCH. Usually this includes music, heavily discounted menu items, and contests promoted thru social media. Sam uses connections with local media to issue a Press Release (\*See Example in Appendices Section) that is seen by several outlets, and leads to media coverage of the opening of the location.

Additionally, since the first Sammy's has opened, Sam has understood the absolute value of using text message marketing to reach customers immediately. Each location has a keyword, use in connection with a text "short code" and has captured a database of unique customers.

Sam's business ownership experience has also had a major impact on the way Sammy's is run. Keeping overhead very low, with well-trained employees, and calculated food costs, contributes to Sammy's being able to establish each location quickly. It doesn't take many employees to run each location. A manager, assistant manager, and 4-5 additional employees is all it takes to cover the shifts necessary to keep each location operating at a highly functional pace. Often times, part time workers can be younger, student age employees, who find the

"coolness factor" of working at Sammy's to be very enjoyable. Employees of this classification attract customers in the same category, and this contributes to the success of the restaurant.

All employees are expected to conduct themselves within the scope of the following Policies and Procedures Manual:

## Sammy's policy manual

This manual is intended to outline the policies employees of Sammy's are expected to adhere to. This manual does not represent a contract between the employer and the employee. Employment with Sammy's is at will, therefore, Sammy's may terminate employment at any time, with or without cause, whenever it believes such action is appropriate including when an employee is not performing the duties of the employees position to the satisfaction of Sammy's.

### Attendance

availability- every employee is required to be available for one weekend night each week.

an employee's first priority is to Sammy's. If an employee chooses to work outside the company, he/she may do so, provided:

outside employment is approved

outside employment does not interfere with the employee's work performance of Sammy's

employees are expected to be prompt and regular in attendance, regardless of outside obligations.

It is the responsibility of the employee to find a substitute to cover scheduled shifts, and the substitution through the manager. if the employee fails to work a scheduled shift he or she will receive a writeup. After two absences an employee will be given a 2nd writeup. additional absences will be grounds for termination.

If you are absent for medical reasons, absences are excused up to 2 days. any more than 2 sick days per incident will require a doctors note. Additional absences with out a doctors note will be subject to disciplinary action as stated above.

tardiness- employees are expected to be at work on time for their scheduled shifts. any employee that fails to do so will receive a verbal warning. Second offense, written warning. Excessive lateness will be considered grounds for termination of employment.

## **Scheduling**

The schedule will be emailed to your Sammy's email address each and every Friday-Sunday for the upcoming week. If you would like to change shifts with another person, you may do so, but ONLY if it is approved by the manager 24 hours prior to when that shift starts. No one may work over 40 hours a week, if you want to pick up someone else's shift but have worked 40 hours, you may not do so.

-Requesting time off: Time off will be given on a "first come, first serve basis". The employees with a (1) next to their name will be given highest priority and (2) etc. If you wish to request a day or weekend night off you must write it on the calendar. Failure to do so may result in failure to have the time off.

\*\*\*\*REMEMBER it is "REQUESTING a day off", not "GETTING the day off"\*\*\*\*

## **Performance**

Customer service- Sammy's is a friendly atmosphere, and the employees are required to be so at all times. Smiling politely even under stressful or unpleasant situations is a must! Remember, making sure each customer enjoys his or her visit is your job. Doing so will help keep Sammy's the fun experience it is.

Cleaning Standards-Sammy's is a wonderfully small and old cafe. As such, it requires even more work to keep it clean. Each employee is responsible for upholding the Sammy's standard of cleaning as explained in training and in the manual. Failure to perform your duties will result in a write-up.

Insubordination: The characteristics present in insubordination would be a willful, verbal refusal of instructions, willful disregard of management authority, disrespect, rudeness, rebelliousness or disobedient gestures, manner or attitude, dismissive gestures, walking away, abusive language, knocking the written instruction or notification of enquiry from the senior manager's hand, or taking it and discarding it, addressing the senior manager or director or supervisor in a disrespectful manner. Insubordination is subject to write-ups and or immediate dismissal.

Cell Phones: ABSOLUTELY no cell phones while working (unless you are a manager). If a Manager needs to get a hold of you while you are working, we have a landline that they may call, eliminating any need for cell phones. If you are caught with your cell phone it will result in being written up.

Discounts: Each employee will receive 50% off all food at Sammy's, however they may only use this discount for themselves (not their friends, family and spouses) using your discount for other

people will result in being written up and/or terminated. Each time you purchase food at Sammy's another employee must ring you up at the cash register. NO one else is behind the counter unless you are an employee of Sammy's Café.

**On Call:** On weekday shifts we will have on-call workers. On-call means that you are ready to work and to be at Sammy's within ten minutes of being called. Make sure you are answering your phone and can be there in ten minutes.

### **Dress Code**

Sammy's employees are required to maintain proper cleanliness and grooming standards. A clean-kept appearance is required. Long hair must be restrained by a ponytail. These standards are up to the discretion of the owner and manager.

Sammy's employees must come to work in uniform: Sammy's T-shirt, close-toed shoes, and jeans or slacks. Shorts are only permitted if they are mid-thigh in length. Pajamas bottoms and exercise clothing is not allowed.

### **Misuse/Theft of Property**

1. Removing any Sammy's property from the premises is theft and is a serious offense.

Theft is immediate grounds for dismissal

### **Safety and Security**

NO one else is behind the counter unless you are an employee of Sammy's Café that is currently clocked in.

Employees must use the equipment for their intended purposes.

Employees are required to report injuries to the manager within 12 hours of the incident. First seek medical attention.

In the instance of an emergency, there is a silent alarm under the register.

All employees are required to obtain and keep a current food handlers permit as required by Utah State Law. New employees must give a copy of their current food handlers permit within the first two weeks of their employment.

**Drug and Alcohol-** The use of drugs and alcohol is strictly prohibited while conducting Sammy's business.

The owner or manager has the right to change policies at any time, with or without advance warning.

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMER CONT.**

In 2011 Sammy's opened a location in Pleasant Grove Utah, and unfortunately due to this location having the highest overhead expense by way of monthly rent expense and utilities costs of all our locations, and a student base that didn't connect well with the downtown Pleasant Grove community, it required the closing of the store in December of 2012. Significant successes in knowing what to look out for in future Sammy's locations to prevent this from happening again were learned in this process. There still exists a very large database of customers who are subscribed to the Facebook page, and also the text message list of the Pleasant Grove location. Our customers were very sad to see us close this location! Curious persons can see this feedback on the Sammy's Pleasant Grove Facebook page.

Sam's catering background came from growing up in a family of caterers. His grandparents owned Startups Candy factory in Provo, Utah, and they moved to Southern California in 1946 to open Startups Catering. Many of his grandparent's children and grandchildren have opened catering businesses as well. His own parents continue to operate Bashful Butler Catering in California, and several Uncles and Cousins have catering businesses as well. While Sam has no current ownership of a catering company, he has a local cousin with a business called Custom Catering and Events, located in Pleasant Grove. While not directly part of this proposal, Custom Catering would be the vendor that would fulfill the part of this proposal requesting in house catering services. They have been in business since 2011, and have seen steady growth and progress through traditional marketing, social media, and networking relationships with organizations like Corporate Alliance. They have catered events in the current Sunset Room, as well as the former Sunset Room tent at Cedar Hills Golf Course, including the Annual Cedar Hills Golf Tournament. Food services for this event were arranged with former Golf Pro Jim Madsen, and he would be a reference for Custom Catering and the owner Hyrum Knapp.

### **SECTION 2                      PROPOSER QUALIFICATIONS**

With Sammy's already having multiple locations, and an established menu, we are confident the opportunity to open a location in the Cedar Hills Golf Course Concession & Grill is a great fit. This location would serve to provide the Sammy's experience to a new geography of customers, and we are confident that we can bring several of the Pleasant Grove customer base to Cedar Hills to begin enjoying again the savory and sweet treats they grew to love!

Although we have not had a Sammy's location in a Golf Course Clubhouse as of yet, we feel very strongly that the menu, the ambience, and the attraction will be enjoyed immensely by the golfing community. Our company, as well as Custom Catering, has several golfers who are very familiar with how a food services establishment in the confines of a golf environment should function efficiently. We can advertise on the golf course, usually the 9<sup>th</sup> tee, as well as on scorecards etc. the number for golfers to

call and place their order, and make sure they have their food items ready as they make the turn to the 10<sup>th</sup> hole, and we can have a runner take their foods to them, given the layout of Cedar Hills golf course.

-Sammy's would plan to offer an additional Breakfast menu not typical for our other locations, and our regular menu would serve for lunch and dinner. In addition we would provide the normal concessions like candy bars, soft drinks, etc.

-We will use our existing Text message lists, customer databases, Facebook pages, and relationships to drive traffic to Cedar Hills, not just from our previous Pleasant Grove location, all current locations as well. We are confident that our menu will make Cedar Hills Golf Course a favorite destination for all golfers in Utah, as they know they will be able to enjoy a vast menu of gourmet hamburgers and sandwiches, as well as our "World Famous Pie Shakes", as they end their round of golf on this phenomenal course!

Custom Catering will carry no expectations to be the exclusive caterer. They will however use the Sunset Room as the location to meet with every potential customer regardless whether they have a chosen venue for their event, so as to bring exposure to the clubhouse, and Sunset Room. They would also be available to be the booking agent for the Sunset Room, and maintain the calendar of availability if the City has interest in such.



# Teaching Personal Safety to Your Child

- Avoid scare tactics. Explain that most adults want to protect children and keep them safe.
- Emphasize your children's basic right to body privacy and ownership. Every child is in charge of their own body and keeping it safe.
- Teach your children age-appropriate, basic sex education.
- Children have the right to say "No!" to any touch that makes them feel uncomfortable.
- Give your children a sense of self-worth and dignity at every opportunity.
- Let your children know they can tell you anything and that you will believe them. Most importantly, let them know that abuse would not be their fault and that they would not be in trouble for telling someone if they were being hurt on purpose.
- Get to know your children's friends and their families. Know where your children are, whom they are with, and what they are doing.

## Parent Plan:

Teach your children the safety rules and practice often:

### **Under 10 years old:**

- Listen to the "UH-OH" feeling
- Say "NO!"
- Go tell a trusted adult

### **Over 10 years old:**

- Recognize anything that makes you feel afraid or uncomfortable
- Resist by saying no and getting away
- Report to a trusted adult



# MAKING YOUR OWN PINWHEEL



Here's a craft project that will allow children a chance to participate in your community's "Pinwheels for Prevention" activities. This activity can be used in schools, daycare centers, after-school programs, church groups, etc.

## Pinwheel Wind Collector

### Materials

- A push pin
- A square piece of construction paper (about 8.5" by 8.5")
- A sharpened pencil with an eraser
- Scissors

### Procedure

1. Lay the square paper flat on a table and draw a line diagonally from each corner to the opposite corner.
2. Mark the center of the square where the two lines cross and punch a small hole through it with the pencil tip.
3. Next, cut along each line stopping about an inch from the hole in the center of the square.
4. Take the pin and punch a hole in the top left corner of each of the four flaps. (No two holes should be next to each other.)
5. Pick up a flap at a punched corner and carefully curve it over toward the center hole, securing it with the pin.
6. Repeat this for the other flaps.
7. When all four flaps are held by the pin, carefully lift the paper without letting the flaps unfurl.
8. Lay the pencil flat on a table and carefully push the point of the push pin into the side of the eraser.
9. Now your pinwheel is complete and ready to go.  
Pick up the pinwheel near the pencil point and let it catch the wind.








