This work session of the City Council of the City of Cedar Hills, having been posted throughout the City and the press notified, was called to order at 6:13 p.m. by Mayor McGee.

Noticed agenda items for this Regular Council Meeting (6:13 p.m.)

- City Manager Report and Discussion
 - Decisions 2008 is kicking off next week. It will feature many of the same questions for the sake of comparison. Konrad Hildebrandt would like feedback from the Council on what kind of analysis they would like to see.
 - Jim Madsen has requested that sledding be prohibited on the east side of the golf course. Konrad Hildebrandt proposed putting up a fence and signage. C. Perry stated that the area has become a popular spot for sledding and would like to look at the area since the golf reconfiguration. C. Wright would like to leave the area open to sledding.
 - The City would like to get its own zip code, but has thus far been unsuccessful.
 - In City continues to work with Highland and Alpine on participation in a Lone Peak Recreation District. Alpine and Highland are unwilling to commit to participation.

Discussion on the Cottonwood Well (6:34 p.m.)

David Bunker stated that the pump maxes out at 2,000, but the hole is capable of more. To install a larger pump would cost about \$30,000 plus \$540/hour to pump it at an estimate of 40 hours. The larger pump will be available next week, and require at least a week of pumping. The pumping capability should be known within 2 weeks.

Noticed agenda items for this Regular Council Meeting (6:40 p.m.)

- Board and Committee Reports
 - C. Kirk: Took a tour of the recycling facility. It will get a \$2 million overhaul in October. He will put together a few paragraphs on common recycling mistakes for the City newsletter. Waste Management is proposing a profit sharing system with communities that participate.
 - C. Perry: The Youth City Council is planning more activities.
 - C. Richardson: The Planning Commission recommended a code amendment to require electronic submittal for agendas and recommended approval to Chase Bank's updated design.
