This work session of the City Council of the City of Cedar Hills, having been properly noticed, was called to order at 6:08 p.m. by C. Kirk, Mayor Pro-Tem.

- Report by the Blue Ribbon Recreation Committee
 - C. Jackman stated that the Blue Ribbon Recreation Committee is in a fact-finding mode and are interested in what the Council wants for a recreation center. Their concern is putting in a lot of time and effort into making proposals just to find out the Council doesn't like any of the proposals. The Committee wants to divide the proposal into phases, come to the Council with plans, get feedback from Council on how to move forward, and then move to the next phase. The Committee has to balance what the community wants with what Council envisions. Right now is not the best time for bonding.
 - Mayor Richardson stated the Committee feels this project is too enormous to be taken on all at once and wants to start off with whether or not to do something now and setting a reasonable budget. He agrees with this assessment. The Committee consists of a very diverse group with a lot of expertise. There was some good consensus at the last Committee meeting. The next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, June 3.
 - C. Kirk stated that he was very happy with the consistency and make-up of the Committee. He didn't feel members weighed heavily on one side or the other. He was looking forward to receiving recommendations. He was hoping 25 people could canvas the community a lot better than five people. He would like to see three options, listed in order of priority, presented to the Council that are determined by research and findings. He suggested the Committee speak to every member of the Council individually and not as a collective group. The Committee was organized to gather information and give direction.
 - C. Perry said he prefers a more hands-off approach and would like the Committee to come to the Council with lots of options. It is great that people are agreeing, and the Committee knows the Council is on-board with spending only the money available. He doesn't want to intrude or interfere in any way.
 - C. Martinez thought there would be a presentation by the Committee tonight and would then be on the ballot for November if the Council liked it.

- Report on Family Festival

Ashley Vogelsberg presented a list of Council assignments for the Family Festival. The first Family Festival event is swim night at the Lindon pool on June 19 from 6:30-8:30 p.m. and is free with the purchase of a Family Festival wristband. June 22 is skating at Classic Skating, which is also free with a wristband. June 23 is the Cedar Hills Golf Tournament, and June 25 is dinner and a movie, which will be Cloudy with a Chance of Meatballs. Matiki Grill will be doing the dinner again, and the Council will serve brownies. On June 26 the 5-K Run will start at 6:30 a.m., the mile will start at 7:00 a.m., and the parade will start at 9:00 a.m. The Council will meet at the City Office at 8:15 a.m. to pick up the golf carts, which will be loaded with candy. C. Wright will judge the baking contest, which will have different categories. Staff is working on donations and donated prizes. There will be inflatables as usual, and Little Bee Craft is in charge of the vendors. The event to find coins in the sand is dependent on donations. The fireworks will be shot from the Golf Course again with music provided with a sound system. The Orem Owlz game will be June 28. Staff has contacted many people for the parade and is waiting to hear back. Staff has contacted a lot of parade entries from Pleasant Grove Strawberry Days. Lone Peak Band chose to go to Lehi City, who is paying \$500 for them to participate.

- Mayor Richardson will find someone to throw out the first pitch at the Orem Owlz game.
- C. Martinez will talk to Home Depot about being a parade entry. She wondered about Mountain Dew or Red Bull.
- C. Perry wondered if Little Ceasars could be contacted.
