This work session of the City Council of the City of Cedar Hills, having been properly noticed, was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Gygi.

Mayor Gygi acknowledged the presence of the Miss Pleasant Grove Royalty for 2017 and the Rodeo Royalty. He then invited the individuals to introduce themselves.

MISS PLEASANT GROVE ROYALTY 2017

Miss Pleasant Grove 2017: Lindsay Savage: Ms. Savage said that she was from Pleasant Grove and that she was crowned in March. Ms. Savage invited those present to attend Strawberry Days. Ms. Savage indicated that she was 19 years old was a sophomore at Utah Valley University. Ms. Savage explained that she participated in pageants because her platform was raising mental illness awareness, an issue that is extremely important to her. As Miss Pleasant Grove she had opportunities to talk with larger audiences about this important issue.

1st attendant: Ansley Funes: Ms. Funes stated that she was 17 years old and had just graduated with her associate degree and would be a junior at Brigham Young University in the fall. Ms. Funes stated that this was the second pageant in which she had participated. Her primary motivation for participating in the pageant was the scholarship money she could earn. In addition, she enjoyed meeting the other participants and making new friends. Ms. Funes stated that her platform focused on the importance of education. With regard to Strawberry Days, which will run from June 11-17, Ms. Funes made particular note of the Grand Parade that would take place on the 17th.

3rd attendant: Sami Jo Carson: Ms. Carson stated that her motivation for participating in the pageant was to promote her platform of community service. She stated that she was 18 years old and that she was a sophomore at Utah Valley University. Ms. Carson stated that her favorite part about Strawberry Days was Huck Finn Days, which would take place at 9:00 a.m. on Friday morning. This was a free event for children and their families.

RODEO ROYALTY

Shawnee Harward – Queen: Ms. Harward stated that she was crowned just the week prior to this meeting. Ms. Harward stated that she was 17 years old and would be attending Utah State University in the fall. Ms. Harward stated that she started doing Rodeo Queen Pageants because she loved the sport of rodeo and she wanted to promote the sport as much as possible. Ms. Harward indicated that the Strawberry Days Rodeo would be on June 14th, 15th, 16th, and 17th. Each show would start at 8:00 p.m. with pre-show entertainment starting at about 7:00 p.m. All tickets were reserved seating and were available online and at other locations.

Sydney McManus - 2nd Attendant: Ms. McManus stated that she was 21 years old and was from Heber City. Ms. McManus stated that she would be a fourth-year student at the University of Utah as an elementary education major. Ms. McManus stated that she was passionate about the sport of rodeo and wanted to be an ambassador for the youth and the sport of rodeo. In addition, Ms. McManus stated that she was passionate about education and improving the educational system. With regard to the Strawberry Days Rodeo, Ms. McManus stated that June 14th was kids' night, June 15th was family night, June 16th was "Tough Enough to Wear Pink" night, and June 17th was the fireworks night. Ms. McManus invited everyone to attend the rodeo.

Mayor Gygi thanked the royalty for attending the meeting, and for all that they do. He also assured them that he would be attending the rodeo.

Mayor Gygi announced that the City Council would go into Closed Session and invited a motion to that effect.
