

- ◆ **Remember to get your Orem Owls baseball tickets!** July 10 will be dedicated to Cedar Hills residents. Mayor McGee will throw the first pitch of the game, the national anthem will be sung by resident Steve Dimond, and Cedar Hills Boy Scout Troop 1206 will be the color guard. Discounted tickets are available at the City office for \$1 per person.
- ◆ **IMPORTANT CHANGES TO RACE TIMES:** The times have changed for the 5K & Gorilla Mile races. Registration and pre-registration pick up will begin at 6:30AM. The 5K will begin at 7:30AM. Also, this year the top finisher of the 5K will win a FREE entry into the St. George Marathon!
- ◆ **Outdoor Youth Dance**—Get your youth out of the house on July 15 to enjoy some good wholesome fun at the newest event of the Festival. ## Library Reimbursement

Beginning July 1, funds have been allocated for the library reimbursement service. Households that purchase a non-resident library card may come to the Cedar Hills City office to receive reimbursement. Just bring the **original** library receipt showing the fee paid, dated after July 1, 2006, and receive the actual fee or up to \$40.00 of the total amount. One reimbursement is allowed per household, per year.

## Park Use and Rules

In Cedar Hills we have beautiful parks and trails. To keep them clean and ready to be enjoyed, we all need to do our part.

- Keep dogs on a leash and clean up animal waste. (This applies not only in the parks, but throughout the entire City.)
- Respect the privacy of landowners near parks and along the trails.
- Keep the parks and trails litter free.
- The park facilities are closed from dusk to dawn—this means when it's dark, you may be cited for being in the park.
- No equestrian use (except Bonneville Trail) or motor vehicles on the trails.
- No smoking, fires, or open flames.
- No alcoholic beverages, fire arms, or hunting.

By following these rules and guidelines, the parks will continue to be peaceful and beautiful. If you see suspicious activity along trails or in the parks, please contact the police at 763-3020. Report any items that need attention to the City office at 785-9668.

## New Lawn Variance Ends

Residents with newly landscaped lawns, please be aware that the watering variance for new sod or seed ended June 30, 2006. Currently, everyone is required to follow the City's prescribed outdoor watering restrictions and schedule. No variance will be given for new lawns during the months of July or August.

## Water Conservation Tip

Did you know that 65% of a home's water usage goes toward outdoor watering? A typical homeowner uses approximately 50 inches of water per year, about twice the amount their landscape actually needs. It takes a combination of things to conserve water outdoors, such as knowing what type of soil is in your yard (sand, loam, clay), mowing your lawn to the correct height (3 inches), and knowing how much and how frequently to water your lawn throughout the year. Conserving water is not as difficult as you may think. Consider this: For every irrigation cycle the homeowner skips, on average it saves enough water for 104 showers, 52 baths, or 312 toilet flushes (Utah Division of Water Resources, 2006). **Weigh-In Clinics/Equipment Distribution** - Saturday, July 15, 8:00 am-noon for 6-8th grades; 11:00am-1:00pm for 1-5th grades at the equipment shed south of the baseball diamond at the Highland Heritage Park. Equipment distribution will require a \$150 deposit (by check). Checks will be secured until the end of the season when equipment is returned to the league. **Please bring your medical form** (can be found on the Web site) **signed by a physician**.

**Football Camp 4-9th Grades** - July 25 thru July 28 from 8:00am-noon. Registration is \$150.00 (by check). See Web site for more details. A **Coaching Clinic** will be held in conjunction with these dates in the evenings from 6:00-9:00pm at Lone Peak High School (no fee).
