City Council Positions

This year a municipal election will be held to fill three City Council positions (4-year terms) that will be on the ballot. The following are qualifications for City Council candidates:

- 1. Be a United States citizen at the time of filing.
- 2. Be a registered voter of the municipality.
- 3. Be a resident of the municipality for at least 365 consecutive days immediately preceding the date of the election.
- 4. Any person convicted of a felony, or any person convicted of treason or a crime against the elective franchise (city), may not hold office in this State until the rights to vote and to hold elective office have been restored.

If you are interested in filing for candidacy, a Declaration of Candidacy form must be completed in person at the City office. The filing period is July 1 through July 16 during regular office hours.

City Meeting Updates

City Council Meeting - May 1, 2007

- Ordinances were adopted approving Bridgestone, Plat F and Plat G, with conditions.
- Preliminary approval was granted to the Cedar Hills Retail Subdivision.
- Action was taken to allow the City staff to move forward with an application for the Utah County Commission 2007 Municipal Recreation Grant
- The 2008 Fiscal Year preliminary budget was approved.
- An executive session was held. No action was taken.

Special Planning Commission Meeting - May 8, 2007

• The Cedar Hills Retail Subdivision was reviewed by the Planning Commission, who recommended approval.

City Council Meeting - May 15, 2007

- A resolution was adopted to begin the bonding process for public improvements, including a new well.
- Two ordinances were approved authorizing the final site plan approval of the Cedar Hills Retail Subdivision, including Wal-Mart and Phillips Edison.
- An executive session was held. No action was taken.

Planning Commission - May 24, 2007

Approval for a wireless telecommunications ordinance was reviewed and recommended.




It's weed abatement time!

Once again the Weed Abatement Task Force is out eliminating weeds from the City of Cedar Hills. Beginning June 1, the task force will cut down weeds on City properties. In the mean time, residents should remove weeds from their own private properties, including unlandscaped yards, vacant lots, side yards, mow strips, etc. Then, beginning June 30, the Task Force will clear weeds from private properties and bill the individual owners for the service. Water conservation is everything

Since Utah is the second driest state in the country, our water resources are critical. Knowing how and when to water not only conserves water, but it saves you money and makes lawns healthier. Here are a few tips on how to be more water-wise:





- Cycle watering schedules into two or three applications, allowing an hour between watering sessions to let the water soak in. This works effectively no matter what type of soil you have.
- Turn sprinklers off during and/or following a significant rainstorm. Do not turn them on again until it's evident that lawn and plants need watering.
- Water brown spots by hand to avoid over-watering the rest of your lawn.

WARNING! Call Blue Stakes before you dig

If you're planning an outdoor project that involves digging holes or trenches in your yard, remember to first call Blue Stakes at least two business days before you dig, grade, or excavate. Knowing where buried lines are located may protect you from injuries caused by accidentally hitting a gas, electric, cable, telephone, fiber-optic, or other buried line. It can spare you repair costs, and it's the law.

Call Blue Stakes, preferably between the non-peak hours of 11 a.m. and 3 p.m., Monday through Friday. (Blue Stakes' regular business hours are Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.; closed on holidays.) After receiving

your call, each participating utility will send a representative to mark its line locations for FREE. After calling, wait two full business days (48 hours) to be sure all lines are marked, and make sure you understand where you can dig.

A new federally-mandated national "Call Before You Dig" number, 811, officially went into service this month. One call to 811 will direct you to Blue Stakes, Utah's line-location service provider.
