City Meeting Updates

City Council Work Session – April 13, 2010

- The Council reviewed portions of the proposed Fiscal Year 2011 Budget.

City Council Work Session – April 20, 2010

- The Council reviewed Golf Course Revenues and Expenditures for the proposed Fiscal Year 2011 Budget.

City Council Meeting – April 20, 2010

- Resolution No. 4-20-2010A was approved, appointing Council-member Kirk to the Utah Valley Dispatch Special Service District.
- The Council finished reviewing the Golf Course Revenues and Expenditures.
- Resolution No. 4-20-2010B established new fee of \$50 for after-hours culinary water restoration.

- The Council approved a property exchange located at approximately 9764 N Meadow Drive.
- An Executive Session was held regarding litigation and the sale of land.

Public Hearing and Planning Commission Mtg. – April 29, 2010

- The Commission continued their discussion regarding amendments to the City Code, Title 10, Chapter 6, Article B, Planned Residential Developments (PRD).
- Review of the City's General Plan began with the section on streets.
- A recommendation was made to the City Council regarding Average Daily Traffic (ADT) on City streets by proposing changes to the City Code, Subdivisions.

City-wide Watering Schedule Provisions

In an effort to allow more flexibility for residents to determine the most efficient watering schedule for their lawn's needs, the City Council currently **will not** enact landscape watering restrictions. In addition, the City actively promotes water conservation and encourages residents to learn all they can about this important topic. Read information on the **Utah Division of Water Resources** Web site about watering, mowing, and fertilizing your lawn specific to North-Central Utah. Here are some ideas for ensuring that you are using water wisely:

- Evaluate your residential landscape irrigation plans throughout the watering season, accounting for cooler temperatures, changing weather conditions, varying soil types, plant materials, maturity of lawn and landscaping, and reviewing the necessary steps for achieving a healthy lawn.
- We encourage every resident to obtain a **Slow-the-Flow** evaluation of their lawn and sprinkling system. This service is valuable in determining the soil type, depth of roots, and effectiveness of the sprinkling system. Go to www.slowtheflow.org to schedule this FREE service and to view valuable conservation tips.
- On the Slow-the-Flow Web site, refer to the Utah Weekly Lawn Watering Guide, which is based on weather conditions of the prior week. This guide can help determine when lawns need watering and when they don't.

Just because you CAN water, doesn't always mean you SHOULD. Follow the State's **Irrigation Schedule for Northern Utah** below to establish guidelines for your individual watering needs:

Start-up until April 30: Once every 6 days

May: Once every 4 days

June: Once every 3 days

July: Once every 3 days

August: Once every 3 days

September: Once every 6 days

October: Once every 10 days



No signs allowed in public right-of-way

Help keep the City looking clean and beautiful. With permission from property owners and a \$1 permit per sign from the City, approved signs may be placed on **private property only**. All signs of any type placed in the City's right-of-way will be removed. Short-term signs (up

to three days), such as for yard sales, etc., do not require a permit, but must meet size, type, and placement requirements (private property only). The complete sign ordinance may be obtained at the City office or viewed on the City's Web site.



It's Weed Abatement Time!

Once again the Weed Abatement Task Force will eliminate weeds from the City. In June the task force will begin cutting weeds on City properties. Please be aware that they will also be assessing lots throughout the City. We ask for voluntary compliance with the removal of any weeds from your property, including un-landscaped yards, vacant lots, side yards, mow strips, etc. Notices will be sent to property owners who have not complied with the City's weed abatement requirements. Why pile it on the street?

With the nicer weather, you might be thinking of a landscaping project. Keep in mind that it is illegal to pile anything on the street or sidewalk. Stockpiles are a safety hazard, obstructing vision and impeding pedestrians and automobiles. In addition, materials such as soil, compost, rocks, etc. can be washed into the storm drain system, causing excess sediment to clog the system. It is best to have stockpiles delivered onto lawns or driveways at a time when they can be quickly put into place. Always sweep and dispose of the residue, rather than washing debris into the storm drain.

One-Day Delay in Garbage Service

During the week of Memorial Day there will be a one-day delay in garbage services. Monday pickups will occur on Tuesday, and Friday pickups will occur on Saturday. Please have totes at the curb before 7:00 a.m. on pickup days. 
