## Are you registered to vote?

Please be sure you are registered to vote! If you have changed your name or address, even within the City, it is necessary to re-register. You can now register online or prepare your mail-in registration form online at [www.vote.utah.gov](http://www.vote.utah.gov). Forms are also available at the City office or register in-person at the Utah County Elections Office, 100 East Center, Room 3100, Provo, Utah.

## Be aware of the following dates:

**August 14:** Last day a new resident of Utah can establish a 30-day voting residence prior to the Primary Election.

**August 15:** Last day to register to vote via mail (postmarked 30 days before the Primary Election).

**August 29:** Last day to register in-person with the County Clerk or online for the Primary Election (15 days before Primary Election)

**September 13: Primary Election**

**November 8: General Election**

## City Meeting Updates

### Work Session – July 12, 2011

- Miss Santaquin Michaela Meacham invited the Council to Santaquin City's Orchard Days.
- Final reports on the Family Festival 2011 were presented.
- The Reynolds family was presented a check for \$2,511 to help Jessica Reynolds. The funds were raised through the 5K race during the Family Festival. Mayor Richardson announced July 12, 2011, as Jessica Reynolds Day.

### City Council Meeting – July 12, 2011

- An opt-out recycling program was reviewed. The Council asked the mayor and staff to continue to explore recycling options but not move forward with a contractual change with recycling with Waste Management.
- A boundary line adjustment was approved between Juniper Heights, Plat B, Lots 69 and 68.
- The concept for the Holiday Oil site plan was approved, subject to a special improvement district for roads, subdivision approval, review of the access on Cedar Hills Drive, and location of the car wash.
- A policy for exempt employee severance was continued.
- An executive session was held regarding the character and competence of an individual, sale or purchase of property, and pending litigation.

### Planning Commission Meeting – July 28, 2011

- Amendments to the City Code 10-5 regarding Signs and Campaign Signs were recommended to the City Council.
- Amendments to the City Code 10-6A and the Guidelines for the Design and Review of Planned Commercial Development Projects were recommended to the City Council with no changes.
- The designation of streets and highways as open for street-legal, all-terrain vehicle use was discussed, and a public hearing will be set for the August meeting.

### The Easiest Way to Pay Your City Bill

The City's online bill payment option saves time and offers more flexibility in how your monthly water bill is paid. If you have an Internet connection and an e-mail address, you can pay your bill online, using any major credit card. It's fast, it's easy, and you no longer have to write a check each month or find a stamp when it's time to send in your payment. To sign up, go to the City's Web site and click on Xpress Bill Pay. There are many benefits of going to paperless billing using Xpress Bill Pay:

- No more paper statements! Monthly statements will be sent to your email address, along with an online link to the City's newsletter.
- Several years of past statements are viewable through XpressBillPay.com.
- Eliminate late fees! Set up an automatic payment date that is convenient for you.
- All major credit cards accepted.
- Many bank bill-pay options available.
- View and pay bill at any time day or night.

### It's time to check your PI filter

With the higher than normal water levels that we are seeing this year, many of the streams and rivers are very full and running high. Most of the City's pressurized irrigation (PI) water is provided through these sources. We are finding that the water to the system is picking up more vegetation, sediments/fines, and nutrients along the way. The City does use screens system wide, but each residential connection should have a 500 micron filter installed. These filters are intended to keep sediment and debris from clogging sprinkler heads. During a typical season, cleaning your filter at the beginning and end of each season is sufficient. This year, we would recom-

mend that you check your filter a few times during the watering season and anytime that you experience low pressure on your individual system.

## STORM WATER TIP OF THE MONTH We Can Make a Difference!

### Did You Know....

- Every unnecessary irrigation cycle that can be eliminated will save enough water for about 104 showers, 52 baths, 52 loads of laundry, or 312 toilet flushes.
- You could use less water and have a healthier lawn.
- The State's recommended irrigation schedule for the month of August in Northern Utah is once every three days, based on average/normal weather conditions. Precipitation and cool periods may allow postponing or skipping an irrigation cycle.
- Complete a visual inspection of your sprinkler system once a month to look for tilted, clogged, or broken heads. You won't notice problems with your sprinkler system unless you see it in operation.
- The Division of Water Resources found that residents in Utah with automatic sprinkler systems typically water 44% more than the lawn needs. Make sure you use your timer wisely. (Information source: [ConserveWater.utah.gov](http://ConserveWater.utah.gov))
