Annual "Spring Clean-Up"

The City will sponsor its 14th annual "Spring Clean-Up" blitz on Saturday, April 14, AND Saturday, April 21. We have modified how we handle Spring Clean-Up again this year, so please take note of the dates and times that the dumpsters will be available. Large roll-off dumpsters will be available at the following locations on two Saturdays only:

- 1) Sunset Park—9814 N Dorchester Dr.
- 2) Heritage Park—4450 W Cedar Hills Dr.
- 3) Mesquite Park—10440 N Mesquite Way
- 4) Hayes Circle The Cedars
- 5) Timpanogos Cove Park 9508 N Timpanogos Cove
- 6) Morgan Blvd/Sage Vista Dr. (visitor parking lot)

DUMPSTERS WILL BE AVAILABLE **ON TWO SATUR-DAYS**, **APRIL 14 AND APRIL 21**, FROM 7:00 AM UNTIL 5:00 PM **ONLY**. If you are unable to utilize the dumpsters on these two days, the City office provides each household with two annual landfill passes.

Please review the following guidelines to ensure safety and convenience: 1) Do not place any of the following items in the dumpsters: car tires, car batteries, motor oil, appliances, electronic devices, concrete, construction materials,



or liquids of any type. **2)** Tree limbs should not exceed six inches in diameter and **12** feet in length. (Timpanogos Special Service District, TSSD, will accept tree limbs and prunings at no cost. Contact TSSD at 801-756-5231 for details and hours of operation.) **3)** If the dumpster is full, please take the load to another location to avoid scattering debris or creating difficulty in hauling away the dumpster.

The City encourages residents to clean their yards, sweep gutters and sidewalks, and do their best to improve yards and neighborhoods. Owners of vacant lots should ensure that their lots are free of garbage, tall weeds, and other debris. In the spirit of the Spring Clean-Up activities, please take some time to assist those in your neighborhood who may need a helping hand. This event is held to promote community beautification by working together. Please contact the City office if you are interested in coordinating a group project. The City may have resources available to assist you.


Cedar Hills has new fifth voting precinct

Time to close your PI valve


The Public Works Department would like to remind everyone to close their individual pressurized irrigation valve in preparation for the system to be turned on and pressurized around April 15. Closing the valve now will protect your sprinkler system from possible damage when the high-pressured system is energized.

If you are not connected to the City's pressurized irrigation system, information is available on the City's Web site. The connection agreement, diagram, and necessary installation permit (no charge) are all available. If you need assistance locating your individual lateral, the City may be able to assist. Community Covenant Program Jenney Rees, City Council Member

Last month a representative from the U.S. Army approached the City Council to introduce the Community Covenant Program. The intent of the program is to encourage all cities and towns across the country to formally commit to supporting service members and their families during

deployment.

As a city we are currently developing a plan to help the families of Cedar Hills service members who are deployed to a hostile fire area. This plan will allow us to help alleviate some of the burden these families face when a deployment occurs. Additionally, we have already had many generous business owners in our city offer up a variety of resources from discounted to free services for our Cedar Hills service members and their families. We are grateful to those in our community who are joining us in finding ways to express our appreciation for the sacrifice these service members make.

We will have an official signing ceremony on Tues., March 20, at 6:00 p.m., during a Council work session at the Public Works Facility. This signing ceremony will be attended by the Mayor, the City Council, and those business leaders who are joining us in our efforts. A representative from the United States Army will be there, and we encourage any and all interested residents to join us that evening.

Cedar Hills Bond Rating Is Raised

Standard & Poor's Ratings Services raised its rating on the City's series 2005 general obligation (GO) refunding bonds one notch to 'AA-' from 'A+'. The upgrade reflects Standard & Poor's assessment of the city's maintenance of its stable operations, supported by, what Standard & Poor's considers, very strong general fund reserves. "Due to the city's demonstrated budget flexibility, it is our opinion that officials will likely continue to make the adjustments necessary to maintain, what we consider, very strong reserves," said Standard & Poor's credit analyst Daniel Zuccarello.

The rating also reflects Standard & Poor's view of the City's participation in the expanding Provo-Orem regional economy, with additional access to Salt Lake City, strong wealth and income, ability to fund capital projects through pay-as-you-go financing, maintain reserves in the capital projects fund, and moderate overall debt with no additional debt plans.


Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day



The Great Utah Shake Out



On Tuesday, April 17, at 10:15 a.m., Cedar Hills along with the entire state of Utah will experience a 7.0 magnitude earthquake drill. Practice with us and learn to be prepared. Practice DROP, COVER, and HOLD **ON** for at least one minute on the above date and time.

What to Do During the Drill: DROP to the ground (before the "earthquake" drops you!). Take **COVER** by getting under a sturdy desk or table. HOLD ON to it until the "shaking" stops (for one minute).

If there is no furniture nearby, you can still reduce the chance of injury from falling objects by getting down next to an interior wall and covering your head and neck with your arms. If you are in bed, cover your head with a pillow. And if you are in a car, stay put.

What Not to Do During the Drill: Do not run outside or to other rooms. Do not stand in doorways.

During the Drill: From your vantage point, take a peek at what around you may be falling, if this was a real earthquake. In the office: computer monitors, ceiling lights, cabinets, bookcases, filing cabinets, etc. At home: china cabinets, TVs, entertainment centers, dressers, etc. Consider securing these items for when a real earthquake hits. There are currently over 650,000 participants registered for the Shake Out in Utah.
